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Deeds Den

Section 20—Owner's duty to maintain property: Each owner is responsible for maintaining his or her lot and ensuring it has a neat and attractive appearance. This means keeping the grass properly mowed, removing weeds and trash. If an owner fails to maintain their lot, the Developer, or its assignee, may take any action deemed appropriate to make the lot neat

and attractive. The owner shall, upon demand, reimburse the Developer for any expenses incurred.

This includes occupied homes. All yards need to be maintained. Failure to do so may result in fines and could include a lien being placed on the homeowner.

The city of Georgetown collects garbage in Cherry Blossom every Wednesday. Herbie trash containers

should be placed next to the curb by 7:00am on Wednesday. Please note, they cannot be placed out earlier than 6:00pm on Tuesday and MUST be removed from the street prior to 10:00pm on Wednesday.

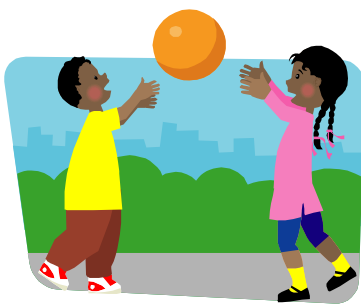
I volunteered to be the Neighborhood Watch rep to become involved in Cherry Blossom, a community we have watched for the past 4-5 years, as we searched for a place to call “home.” We were impressed with the camaraderie of the CB residents and the reputation it has within Georgetown.

As we gear up for the summer season, just wanted to share the following helpful hints on how to protect your home and your family better:

THIRTEEN THINGS YOUR BURGLAR WON'T TELL YOU:

1. Of course I look familiar. I was here just last week cleaning your carpets, painting your shutters, or delivering your new refrigerator. 2. Hey, thanks for letting me use the bathroom when I was working in your yard last week. While I was in there, I unlatched the back window to make my return a little easier.. 3. Love those flowers. That tells me you have taste...and taste means there are nice things inside. Those yard toys your kids

leave out always make me wonder what type of gaming system they have. 4. Yes, I really do look for newspapers piled up on the driveway—and I might leave a pizza flyer in your front door to see how long it takes you to remove it. 5. If it snows while you're out of town, get a

neighbor to create car and foot tracks to and from the house. Virgin drifts in the driveway are a dead giveaway. 6. If decorative glass is part of your front entrance, don't let your alarm company install the control pad where I can see if it's set. That makes it too easy. 7. A good security company will place alarms at the window over the sink, as well as, the windows on the second

floor, which often access the master bedroom—and your jewelry. It's not a bad idea to put motion detectors up there too. 8. It's raining, you're fumbling with your umbrella, and you forget to lock your door—understandable. But, understand this: I don't take a day off because of bad weather. 9. I always knock first. If you answer, I'll ask for directions somewhere or offer to clean your gutters. (Don't take me up on it.) 10. Do you really think I

won't look in your sock drawer? I always check dresser drawers, the bedside table, and the medicine cabinet. 11. Here's a helpful hint: I almost never go into kids' rooms. 12. You're right: I won't have enough time to break into that safe where you keep your valuables. But, if it's not bolted down, I'll take it with me. 13. A loud TV or radio can be a better deterrent than the best alarm system. If you're reluctant to leave your TV on while you're out of town, you can buy a \$35 device that works on a timer that simulates the flickering glow of a real television. Tip of the Season: For those who do not have an alarm system (and even for those who do), a good way to deter a burglar breaking into your home is to set off your car alarm. You should keep your key fob on the nightstand or an easy place to access. The commotion will likely cause anyone to run away and will certainly draw the attention of your neighbors!!!!

Real Estate Outlook

As you drive through the neighborhood it is impossible not to notice all the new construction taking place. Cherry Blossom real estate is very active



with three homes currently pending, six homes selling January 1st, and 36 homes currently for sale or proposes as new construction. Homes in Cherry Blossom have sold in 2012 for prices ranging from \$196,250 to \$391,000. The average list to sell price is 94%

in Central Kentucky, but Cherry Blossom is currently much higher with an average of 97.94%. Although Cherry Blossom is not immune from the short sales, and foreclosures, the housing market in Cherry Blossom is strong.

Financial Committee Update

Cherry Blossom Residents,

It is an honor for me to be elected to serve as Treasurer for our homeowners association. I am proud to be not just an HOA Board member, but a resident and neighbor volunteering time and skill hoping to protect our investments in both our neighborhood and homes.

If you missed the annual meeting on March 5th, a quick summary of our financial position is a positive one. We exceeded our budgeted net income by \$4k. Utilities were under budget and we had an allowance for unpaid dues that we did not use. Cherry Blossom HOA will continue

all collection efforts to keep a positive cash flow and keep our money working for our neighborhood. Unfortunately, at the end of 2011, twenty-one (21) residents were delinquent with their annual dues. Including late fees, this amounts to a total of \$8,700 in uncollected dues. Since the close of 2011, only four (4) residents have paid their outstanding dues and late fees. As of March 31, seventeen residents carry a balance and remain past due for a total of \$7,400.

You should have received your 2012 dues invoice. These were mailed in late March with a due date of May 1. If you did not receive your invoice, please let us know and

we will make sure one is mailed promptly. Annual dues for 2012 remain the same at \$250.

Our grasses experienced a little 'freeze and fry' this year with the extreme cold and hot, so we don't expect them to look as nice as they did last year...but, spring is still welcome.

It was brought to the attention of the Landscape Committee that many residents are concerned about the lights on the bridge.

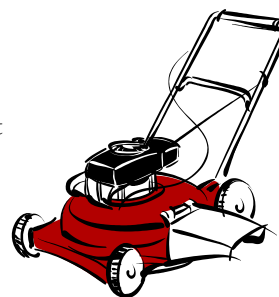
This section of our neighborhood actually belongs to the Golf Course and not the HOA. However, the Landscape Committee has agreed to take over the maintenance of the lights (only) on the bridge so that when they burn out, they will be replaced right away. If you notice a light out, it shouldn't be long before it is replaced.

Please keep a watchful eye out—we have some concerns with the irrigation systems located in various spots throughout the neighborhood.

These are for the flowerbeds in the common areas and not part of the golf course. CBHOA uses 4 Seasons for the service and up-keep with

these systems, so if you notice anyone other than 4 Seasons around these areas, please contact the HOA or the police. If you get a license plate number, that can help.

As always, when warmer weather comes, we need to keep an eye open for children (and maybe some adults) playing in the street. Many residents have complained about people driving too fast, so please try to SLOW DOWN.

Spring is here and summer is fast approaching, which means the kids are out and playing hard. We've already had several injuries and hope to prevent more by asking parents to help their children remember to wear their helmets when riding bikes or scooters.

Did you know about the

GEORGETOWN-SCOTT COUNTY RECYCLING CENTER?

Not everyone is aware of this local center, but we who live in Cherry Blossom do have a convenient opportunity to recycle many things that we currently toss into our trash bins on Wednesday mornings. (On trash mornings you can observe many overflowing garbage cans, filled with items that can easily be recycled.)

Next time you start tossing things into the garbage, please take a look at the list below and see if you and your family couldn't make this world a greener place.

Cardboard (any kind: cereal boxes, shoe boxes, shipping boxes, etc.)

Any Paper Product (newspapers, magazines, copy paper, phone books)

Aluminum and Steel Cans

Plastics #1 and #2 (pop, juice, water bottles, milk jugs, detergent bottles, juice bottles, butter tubs, and most opaque containers).

Simply toss them into a box, toss the box into the trunk of your car and use the drive-thru drop-off center at 1161 Paris Pike, near the Southern States station, between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Tuesdays through Saturdays.

Items that are **not** accepted are

Glass, Styrofoam, plastic containers for vegetables, electronics, paint, furniture, and microwaves.

There is currently a sample test neighborhood in Georgetown that is testing "curbside recycling". However, until the concept is expanded to the rest of the city, including Cherry Blossom, we should do what we can to make it a greener world.
