The safety committee would like to pass along a few great tips to ensure that we all do everything we can to deter any unwanted criminal activity in the neighborhood. Officer Stone from the Georgetown PD had some great tips from his last meeting:

- If you are heading out of town, you can go to the police station and fill out a request for them to stop by your house and take a quick look around.
- Have a neighbor take your trash to the curb and return to the house on trash days.
- Install motion detector lights

on the front and rear of your house.

Other Tips:

- Do not keep keys hidden outside.
- Do not update Facebook or social networking sites when you travel out of town.
- Keep lights inside the house on timers.
- Stop mail and newspaper delivery.
- Place alarm company signs in visible areas
- Take the time to take inventory your valuables. Pictures

and receipts are also a good idea.

Please remain vigilant when parking your cars outside. While the recent rash of break-ins has subsided, we all need to remain vigilant by keeping our eyes and ears open. There is no update on the apprehension of the person believed responsible for the previous break-ins. Again, be on the look out for a white male driving a white Crown Victoria.

Applying insecticide in the month of July along with grub control will keep all unwanted insects, grubs, and bagworms out of your lawn, trees and shrubs. These applications contribute to a healthy lawn and landscape during the hot summer months. If

there is considerable crabgrass, goosegrass, or johnsongrass in your lawn, have an application of post-emergent applied in July or August, especially if you have plans to seed in the fall. This will allow your new seed to germinate quicker and result in a shorter grow-in time for thicker coverage. If you have

New City Park

The Georgetown News Graphic reported that the plans to put in a 22.2 acre park adjacent to the Cherry Hill portion of Cherry Blossom Village is coming to fruition. This will be the first park on the east side of Georgetown and

city officials are hopeful to begin work soon.

Currently, plans call for a pedestrian bridge that will cross over Lands Run Creek, and an unpaved trail system.

Unfortunately, the \$65,000 grant money will not include playground equipment.
